

TASTE OF SCOTLAND

GLASGOW – EDINBURGH: 5 Days | 4 Nights | 4 Breakfasts | 3 Dinners

Day 1: Glasgow Highlights

Meet your tour director at 2:30 pm at your Glasgow hotel and set out on an introductory tour of central Glasgow: once a flourishing shipbuilding and international trade centre. Drive around George Square with its ornate City Chambers and visit Provand's Lordship, Glasgow's oldest house built in 1471. Join your tour director, guide and travel companions for a welcome drink before dinner. (D)

Day 2: Loch Lomond | Loch Ness

Travel alongside the famous Loch Lomond and through the deep valley of Glen Coe, notorious for the Campbell massacre of the Clan Macdonald in 1692. Continue through Fort William and stop at the Spean Bridge Woollen Mill. At Fort Augustus embark on a short cruise on Loch Ness (keep an eye out for 'Nessie'). Continue your journey north to Nairn, for your overnight stay. (B,D)

Day 3: Whisky Tasting | St. Andrews

Drive to Blair Athol Distillery in Pitlochry to see how whisky is distilled and sample some.

Continue south to St. Andrews, renowned as the 'Home of Golf' and for its university (Scotland's oldest) and spend some time exploring on your own. Drive south to Edinburgh to your gracious manor house hotel, set on 1,000 acres with two golf courses and spa facilities, a few miles from the city. Dine at a Scottish Evening on some excellent Scottish cuisine followed by a lively show with songs, stories and traditional dancing. (B,D)

Day 4: Edinburgh Castle | City Tour

This morning tour the principal sights of Edinburgh with a local guide. Drive along the bustling Princes Street and through the gracious, wide streets of the 200-year-old Georgian New Town. Walk along part of the Royal Mile where compact medieval houses reach 11 floors tall. Visit Edinburgh Castle, which dominates the city and contains the Scottish Crown Jewels and the Stone of Scone. The balance of the day is free. On certain August departures, seats are reserved for the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo. (B)

Day 5: Tour ends in Edinburgh (B)

SCOTTISH DREAM

GLASGOW – EDINBURGH: 8 Days | 7 Nights | 7 Breakfasts | 6 Dinners



Day 1: Glasgow City Tour

Your Scottish trip starts at 2:30 pm when you meet your tour director at your Glasgow hotel and tour the city's main attractions. Visit Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum, originally opened in 1901. Meet your tour director and travel companions over a drink before dinner. (D)

Day 2: Loch Lomond & Inveraray

Take a short cruise on beautiful Loch Lomond and a guided tour through stately Inveraray Castle and walk around the village. Cross Rannoch Moor and pass through the spectacular valley of Glen Coe before arriving at your hotel on the west coast. (B, D)

Day 3: Isle of Skye

Drive along the 'Road to the Isles,' famous for its great Highland views and the Glenfinnan Monument. Take a ferry to the Isle of Skye, called the 'Misty Isle.' Visit the Clan Donald Centre at Armadale Castle to discover the history of the Lords of the Isles. Drive through part of the island and return to the mainland by bridge, stopping for photos at the picturesque Eilean Donan Castle. Head to your hotel in Nairn for dinner. (B, D)

Day 4: Culloden Battlefield

Tour Culloden Battlefield Visitor Centre and see where Bonnie Prince Charlie was defeated in 1746. Watch skilled dogs herding sheep and drive south to your gracious manor-style hotel

near Pitlochry. Take a brief tour of this historic hotel and its museum or walk around the gardens and grounds to admire views. (B, D)

Day 5: Blair Athol Castle & Distillery

A short drive will bring you to Blair Castle, home of the Dukes and Earls of Atholl. Dating back to 1269, the castle has been transformed through the ages. Visit Blair Athol Distillery to learn about whisky making and sample a 'wee dram'. Spend the afternoon at leisure to explore Pitlochry, which is within walking distance of your hotel. (B, D)

Day 6: Glamis Castle & St Andrews

Visit Glamis Castle, the legendary setting of 'Macbeth' and childhood home of the late Queen Mother. Head to St Andrews, the 'Home of Golf.' See the famous Royal and Ancient Clubhouse and the Old Course and enjoy free time. Continue into Edinburgh for a lively Scottish Evening with dinner and entertainment. (B, D)

Day 7: Edinburgh Castle & City

Start your Edinburgh tour in the 200-year-old 'New Town.' See medieval townhouses along the Royal Mile. Tour Edinburgh Castle where you can see historic buildings and enjoy splendid views of Edinburgh. The balance of the day is free for independent touring and dining. (B)

Day 8: Tour ends in Edinburgh (B)
