DAVOS

Canton of Graubünden, 1560 m

Davos in Grisons is a place of superlatives: this holiday destination with international ambience is the largest resort in the Alps for mountain holidays, sport and conferences, at 1560 m the highest town in the Alps and a high-altitude health resort with a long tradition. Renowned above all as a conference centre, and also as a major winter and summer sports

centre with an international flavour and a huge range of activities.

Davos offers wide range of hotels with numerous boutiques, cafés and restaurants. At night, too, there's plenty of entertainment, with bars, discos and a casino. Davos is the headquarters of the Federal Institute for Snow and Avalanche Research.

Summer

The cable-cars on the Jakobshorn (2590 m), Parsenn including the Weissfluhjoch und (2844 m), Rinerhorn (2490 m) and Schatzalp/Strela provide access to three hiking areas with a total of 700 km of marked footpaths. Anyone seeking rest and relaxation amid unspoilt nature should head off on foot, by bike or by horse-drawn carriage up the romantic side valleys of Sertig, Dischma or Flüela.

For a change of scene, visit the Davos Lake with its swimming area and a sailing and surfing centre. Davos is also the starting point for excursions on the famous Glacier and Bernina Express.

Winter

Davos is a winter sports metropolis for skiing and snowboarding fans from all over the world. At altitudes between 1124 and 2844 m, guests will find 58 ski lifts, 300 km of slopes, 75 km of cross-country ski tracks, two artificial ice-skating rinks and Europe's largest natural ice rink and the new 'Ice Dream' for ice hockey, skating and Bavarian curling.

The six Davos-Klosters skiing areas of Parsenn/Gotschna, Jakobshorn, Pisch, Madrisa, Rinerhorn and Schatzalp/Strela have been brought together into one vast winter sports arena. For a quieter time, take a ride by horse-drawn sled or experience the 111 km of beautifully prepared winter footpaths

KLOSTERS

Canton of Graubünden, 1200 m

Klosters offers a unique combination of a renowned mountain resort – the British heir to the throne Prince Charles is a regular guest – and the idyll of an unspoilt Graubünden village. The diverse range of activities on offer in summer and winter is well suited to families with children.

Nestling in what has remained the rural part of the Graubünden, Klosters, with its romantic village-like atmosphere, stands in stark contrast to the nearby Alpine metropolis of Davos. Thanks to the Vereina tunnel, even the Engadine has now become a direct neighbouring region. Klosters belongs to the family resorts bearing the 'Families Destination' quality mark.

Summer

Extensive hiking area in the Klosters/Davos region with 700 km of trails ranging from footpaths suitable for prams through to demanding mountain hikes. Madrisa Land, Alpine adventure park: a world of legends and fairy-tales. Over 90 regional legends and popular tales are depicted.

Cyclists and mountain bikers will find routes of varying degrees of difficulty situated around Klosters. One of the highlights is the Gotschna Freeride Piste: this spectacular roller-coaster for mountain bikers is 6 km long. With over 200 banked curves, jumps and waves, the Freeride Piste goes all the way from the Gotschna middle station down to Klosters.

Winter

The Gotschnabahn cable car ferries winter sports fans up into the Davos ski arena. The smaller, sunny Madrisa ski region above Klosters is also suitable for beginner skiers. For off-piste and touring skiers too, the Davos-Klosters region offers attractive conditions. Cross-country skiers will find long trails immediately near Klosters, as well as in the Landwassertal (Davos). Snowboarders prefer the Jakobshorn near Davos.

Non-skiers can avail themselves of winter walking paths, horse-drawn sled rides, toboggan runs and snowshoe trekking – as well as a wide range of après-ski activities and nightlife venues in Klosters, and nearby Davos.
